CLASSES

We have opened the school with four woodland themed classes.

In **Mice** the pupils are learning lots through play and sensory activities.

In Hedgehogs the

pupils are starting to sit more for some Bucket introductions and then complete short work activities but also with lots of learning through play.

Our **Squirrels** are also learning a lot from Bucket activities and individualised work-based activities.

Finally, our **Badgers** are beginning to see some more structured work-based tasks with lots of motivating activities set up around this.

All the classes have a total communication approach taking into account sensory processing needs and occupational therapy assessments.

MICE CLASS UPDATE

What a fantastic start to the year the children (and staff) in Mice class have had! Our topic this term has been 'Marvellous Me' and we have been thinking about who is in our family and what we like and dislike. We have been learning new routines and making new friends. All of the children have



already made huge progress in so many areas and are engaging in more and more every day!

A typical day in Mice class involves plenty of opportunities for playing, singing and dancing. These activities allow the children to explore sharing and turn taking, develop fine and gross motor skills, improve listening skills and, most importantly, have lots of fun! We all like to keep active with regular movement breaks, outdoor sessions and Active skills too. Developing and supporting communication underpins everything we do in the classroom so we have all been learning Makaton signs and finding other ways to communicate what we want, using words, photos, pictures and symbols to make choices.

HEDGEHOG CLASS UPDATE

We have all settled into Hedgehogs class fantastically and have made some lovely relationships with our peers and



adults! This term we have enjoyed learning through our topic of Mr Men and Little Miss. We have helped Mr Strong smash pumpkins, made bouncy ball paintings with Mr Bounce and have explored slime experiments with Mr Messy. We have also been learning about the concept 'who' and have enjoyed playing silly games to find who in the class such as 'who is wearing the hat?', 'who is hiding in the box?' and some of us used our understanding to complete silly 'who' sentences. Finally, we have all loved exploring our likes and dislikes in our food tech lessons.

SQUIRREL CLASS UPDATE

Is it really half-term already? Time flies when you're having fun in Squirrels Class! This term, we have focused on setting in to our school routine. We've also spent time learning about kindness and applying this when making new friends. Our topic of 'the senses' has involved touching, tasting and smelling different items – some we liked and some we definitely did not like!

We've loved learning about the story 'Brown Bear, Brown Bear' and have learned to identify and build some description of characters. We have been developing our knowledge of different ways to communicate

using Makaton, symbols and pictures. Well done, Squirrels – you have all had a successful first term at Sladewood Academy and we are so proud of you!

THE CHAMWELL CENTRE

Based at The Milestone School campus, Longford Lane, Gloucester GL2 9EU there are activities aimed at children and young people with disabilities and additional needs taking place year round.
