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MICE CLASS UPDATE

Mice class have been enjoying a transport based topic this term 'Zoom! Zoom!' The children have really {engaged with the stories we have been reading, particularly enjoying 'Naughty Bus' by Jan and Jerry Oke - we recreated some of the naughtiness during our 'Bucket' sessions which was a real attention grabber. In maths the children have been comparing BIG and small objects, sorting and labelling them using words, Makaton signs or gestures. We have seen a huge increase in the amount of interaction and communication over the last few weeks which is fantastic, the children are really starting to develop as a group, playing alongside each other more, we have spent a lot of time practicing sharing and taking turns too. In our topic lessons the children have enjoyed model making and some of them are now beginning to play imaginatively, pretending to be on a train or in a bus! We have also enjoyed celebrating World Book day in our pyjamas and singing songs with a music therapist this term. Happy Easter!







HEDGEHOG CLASS UPDATE

This term in Hedgehogs we have loved learning through our story 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar'. In Our World we have been learning about growth and all took part in an experiment growing kitchen roll caterpillars and we have also learnt about how we grow and have looked at our baby pictures and compared them to how we look now. We have also been developing our understanding of size and have learnt about big, small, bigger, smaller, biggest and smallest. The children were able to order the sizes of our wiggly caterpillars. The hedgehogs also had a fantastic world book day and enjoyed being cozy in our Pyjamas. We enjoyed choosing our favourite stories for adults to read to the class. In our PSHE lessons we have been learning about healthy and unhealthy foods and have looked at all the different foods the caterpillar ate and we even tried some of them! Finally, we have learnt about the Easter story in RE and we all took part in a lesson about surprises, like the surprise of Jesus now being in the cave, and the children enjoyed all the silly surprises the adults had planned. 




Boards
